Dave Roberts told me some time ago, there was no Club 9 in 1992, when they moved to Nico Wynd. It means, it started later. Maybe, 2-3 years later? I don't know. But it was before 1998, as we can see in a photo of a trophy below. The trophy shows the first award in 1998.

When I joined it as a golfer beginner in 2003, we kept our scores every time. The score cards went to Jim Ball. He calculated everybody's handicap and club rating. Later, Jim moved away from Nico Wynd and somehow I inherited his work, keeping the club scores and handicaps. I did it for 3 years, 2005 – 2007, till October 2007, when I had the first of my three hip replacement surgeries.

An example of the club's rating and the leaderboard from 2006 is included at the end. Remember, in that time, all players were 15 years younger.

We used to have annual club tournaments, which may have been started or were combined with Ken Kenney Memorial. I am thinking about it based on a photo of the trophy. The first time the trophy was awarded in 1998.




But the Club was not about golf only. It also was about good times we had, every time we met for the dinners.


There are so many pictures, which could be inserted here to show everybody having fun and enjoying good times. Here is just one example:




