In our backyards.....

Nico Wynd is fortunate to be surrounded by beautiful trails and greenspaces. Along with the greenspaces comes an abundance of wildlife. We have an active eagles nest on the property and eagles, herons and ducks are a regular occurrence on the golf course and dikes. More recently there have been sightings of deer in the early morning hours behind the quads (see photo below).

One type of wildlife that seems to often be misunderstood is also seen regularly at night at Nico Wynd. Yes you guessed it . . . BATS. From horror movies to health warnings, societal attitudes about bats are typically negative.

Half the bat species in BC are considered to be of conservation concern. Even the common Little Brown Myotis, a bat species found here, is now endangered due to high mortality rates from white nose syndrome, a disease that has spread from Washington state to BC. These bats arrive in May to have and raise their pups and then depart at the end of August. The pups learn to fly in July, which is when you might occasionally find a bat in your home.

Bats contribute to our ecosystem in a number of ways. Bats are very important for insect control with some bats eating their weight in insects in a single night. They also are important in pollination and seed dispersal.

To effectively manage and conserve bats amidst various threats, the province conducts an annual bat count. Dawn Bishop, a Nico Wynd resident, is involved with counting the bats here in our community. If anyone is interested in assisting with the count, please let her know. There will be two counts between June 1-21 and two counts between July 11-August 5.

If you find you have bats inside your Unit please call Cy Begon our property manager to assist with their removal.
