GOOD NEWS

In January the LTMC recommended to council that the siding project covered under the 2023/24 CRF budget be put to tender, rather than simply awarding the work to the incumbent contractor. There was some concern at that time that this would delay the much needed work. After some discussions with Kallio, it was determined if we immediately awarded them the work, their earliest start date would be mid-summer. This timing did not favour any advantage for the sake of expediency. The tendering process was seen to offer two advantages; more competitive pricing, and a possible earlier start date. Phil Adams worked with Apex Building Sciences to assemble a list of qualified envelope contractors, six in all. Apex provided all contractors with a tender document consisting of detailed specifications, drawings as

well as general and specific contractual terms. All contractors attended a mandatory site visit, and were asked to respond in 3 weeks. Five out of the six contractors responded, from which two low bidders were shortlisted. Council met with Apex to obtain clarifications, and consult with them on matters relating to their professional experience. The final bid price came in \$100,000 below our budgeted number. The cost savings do not end there. We have a resident who works for a family building supply business. He has offered to supply the successful contractor all applicable project materials at their cost. A post tender addendum is being issued by Apex to the contractor of choice to resubmit a contract price based on his new lower costs. Contractors were asked to submit a start date and duration of construction. Most came in with the same timing, mid-summer. Duration 20 weeks. Thank-you to Phil Adams and the members of the Long Term Maintenance committee for their tireless efforts in bringing this to fruition!

Council has been busy planning a Special General Meeting to be held on June 11 at Elgin Hall to address some resolutions regarding updating some of the current bylaws and rules and to vote on an alternative funding formula to address siding restoration work. Information meetings will be held on May 14 and May 28 to inform residents of the resolutions that will be presented at the SGM and to allow residents to ask questions and voice any concerns about the resolutions. A SGM information package will be mailed out to all residents in early May which will include more specific information about the SGM and the information meetings.
